SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES



Description of first aid measures

Inhalation

Remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing. If breathing is labored, administer oxygen. If symptoms develop, obtain medical attention. Call a POISON CENTER/doctor if you feel unwell.
