Koro # 2 Instructions

Description of Parts

1. Setting Pin or Dog- flat 3.5 inch long .5 inch wide piece soldered to bracket.
2. Safety Hook- J hook located on cinch springs by coils.
3. Trigger Pan with Company name KORO on it
4. Anchor Chain-silver chain to keep predator animal running off with dead animal and trap.
5. Jaw- or strike bars that grip animal's body
6. Cinch Spring- safety pin looking spring

Warning: Coil will break fingers if caught in trap. Gloves may help.
Traps are oily and hands will get dirty.

Step 1: Lay trap out on surface so Koro is written upside down away from your body. Lay cinch springs out to sides. Dog is resting on a 1.5 inch piece of rod soldered to the base of trap.

Step 2: Pull the top strike bar or jaw away from the other allowing the dog to meet the hook on the trigger pan. Slip the dog underneath the hook. The trap is set with the safety hooks in place.

Step 3: Place over hole where rodents are coming in and out. The trap is triggered by the rodent running over the trigger pan. Anchor the trap using drywall screws or wire to keep the animal and the trap firmly in place. You can place bait on the bracket behind the trigger underneath the dog.

Step 4: carefully unhook the safety hooks on each spring keeping fingertips away from the trap jaw. The trap is now set.

Follow all applicable state and local laws. We suggest you check traps every 24 hours.
