Building on the knowledge gained in the prerequisite* NWCOA Bat Standards Certified course, this course continues to cover the practical side of bat work including inspections, exclusion, clean-outs, and decontamination protocol, but also delves deeper into safety, contracts, sales, pricing, and liabilities.

This two-day course provides classroom training on day 1, then on day two the classroom training is put into action as attendees learn about working at heights, scaffolding and ladders. Practical demonstrations and handson applications on metal bending, ridge and roof exhaust vent repairs, chimney repairs and gable vents will also be conducted. When you finish this training, you will be set to expand your business to include professional bat management services.

* **Prerequisite**: To take the Certified Structural Bat Management Professional course, an attendee must be NWCOA Bat Standards Certified.
