Why Use Terror Eyes?

Saves Money Eliminate expensive recurring cleanup and repair costs with a one-time solution. Installing bird control devices like the Terror Eyes can save a substantial amount of money for you or your company.

Instructions:

1. Remove any nests and clean these previously infested areas as much as possible
2. Do not over inflate Terror Eyes.
In fact under inflate about 85%.
3. To increase the random motion of Terror Eyes use the coil spring provided and reinforce it with a piece of strong twine slightly longer. This should prevent it from distorting the spring.
4. When suspending Terror Eyes from a rope it is helpful, in windy areas, to anchor the unit to something stable below it. Use the loop on the bottom of Terror Eyes.
5. Locate Terror Eyes close to the roosting birds with a good line of sight to the infested areas.
6. When installing two or more units hang them each at different heights (a minimum of one unit diameter apart).
7. To prevent birds from getting used to Terror Eyes occasionally relocate units
8. Punctures may be easily repaired with a vinyl bonding agent.
